Music and Worship



All Saints Day will be on November 1. As is our tradition, we will read the names of members who have joined the Church Triumphant since the last All Saints Day. After worship, memorial bricks will be dedicated as well.

We will celebrate Veteran's Day on November 8, the nearest Sunday. At the start of the service, we will ask veterans from each of the armed forces to stand and be recognized. In addition, **veterans or their families are encouraged to bring in photos and memorabilia**. There will be a table at the back of the sanctuary for display. During fellowship time, a special video will be displayed. Watch the bulletin for details.

Advent is quickly approaching. The first Sunday of Advent is November 29, Thanksgiving weekend. This will be a special service that combines worship with the greening of the sanctuary. As a modification of our normal cantata, we will have two Sundays of special music, December 13 and 20, drawn from Handel's *Messiah*. The music will include several guest soloists, and provides plenty of opportunities for people to participate who are not normally in the choir. Watch for announcements closer to the time as Jeff devises a rehearsal schedule. *Messiah* draws its text from scripture and is an excellent way to prepare for the celebration of Christmas.

Our Christmas Eve service will be held on **December 24 at 5:00 pm**. This was a new time last year, which led to many concerns. In the end, attendance was very good. The graph below shows annual average attendance (as compiled from the "who's who in the pew" pads, which therefore underestimates) and Christmas (from usher reports) for the past four years. There was a sharp decline after Pastor Lee's departure, but overall, there is no indication that the time change for Christmas Eve had a net negative effect. I understand that there are some people who are unable to attend at that time, which I regret, but this time is also more amenable to families with young children.
