A Message from Our Pastor Rev. Lou Ellen Hartley

One of the great contrasts between northern Minnesota and southern Missouri is darkness and light. During this time of year in northern Minnesota, darkness comes early, by 4:00 in the afternoon and leaves late, by 8:00 in the morning. For some, the darkness is difficult to manage. We aren't made to live in the dark. Our bodies can't make vitamin D. Our sleep cycles get disrupted, eating habits change, our brains make less happy chemicals, and we can grow depressed. We human beings, in general, must adapt to living in the dark. Imagining so long ago when there was only a fire or the moon to light up the darkness, we can understand why people would celebrate the solstice when days grew longer and the darkness retreated.

So much of this season is the tension between the darkness and light. So often we want all darkness to be pushed out of our lives. We want to live happy lives with nothing of the dark to bring us down. There are other times, however, when darkness may be a shadow, not of death or sadness, but may be a shadow of God reminding us God is close by.

In her book <u>Amazing Grace</u>, Kathleen Norris writes about the incarnation and the angel's first visit to Mary. She writes, "When the angel Gabriel first addresses Mary, it is in exalted, even imperial language: 'Hail, thou that art highly favored, the Lord is with thee.'" Norris reflects on the unlikely setting in which this conversation takes place. Gabriel comes to a vulnerable young woman who is about to become more vulnerable as she will be pregnant and unwed. She is poor and powerless, yet here is this angel bringing a great declaration into her life. The angel tells her she will be the mother of a king whose kingdom will last forever. After a moment of silence, Mary asks, "How can this be?" Then the angel answers her. "The power of the most high will overshadow you; therefore the child will be called the

Son of God." To which Mary responds the only way one possibly could in those circumstances, "Here I am. Let it be."

Kathleen Norris writes, "When a time or place seems touched by God, it is an overshadowing, a sudden eclipsing of my priorities and plans. But even in terrible circumstances and calamities, in matters of life and death, if I sense that I am in the shadow of God, I find light, so much light that my vision improves dramatically. I know that holiness is near. And it is not robed in majesty. It does not assert itself with the raw power of empire (not even the empire of the self in which I all too often reside), but it waits in puzzlement, it hesitates. Coming from Galilee, as it were, from a place of little hope, it reveals the ordinary circumstances of my life to be full of mystery, and gospel, which means 'good news.'"

During this Advent season, may we all sense where God is in our lives. When darkness overwhelms us, may we all find God in the midst of the shadow. As we prepare the way for the Lord's coming, may we pause to notice the mystery and the good news we may otherwise ignore. God is with us, friends, in darkness and in light. Halleluiah! Amen.

Announcement for Congregational Meeting Rev. Lou Ellen Hartley

The session has called a special congregational meeting immediately following the worship service on December 6, 2016 for the purpose of transferring property to the City of Rolla and for electing officers nominated by the congregational nominating committee.

TRANSFER OF PROPERTY: Two years ago the Session approved the donation of the east parking lot to the city of Rolla with the following understanding:

- 1. The Church has unrestricted parking on the lot for overflow during Church events or Church sponsored events.
- 2. The City would grant an easement for any sewer work that had to be done by the Church.
- 3. If the City opts to sell the land at a future date, the Church has first right of refusal.
- 4. Any cost associated with the transfer, such as survey or an updating of the legal description of the property would be assumed by the City.

John Calvin Presbytery has also approved the transfer of the property. In accordance with the Book of Order, the congregation must now vote to approve the transfer.

We have now entered the season of Advent. The first Sunday of Advent is November 29, Thanksgiving weekend. Due to construction in the sanctuary (an upgrade to the registers), this service will be held in the fellowship hall. It will also be a "FIRED UP!" style service. Going forward, we intend to do a FIRED UP! style service (in the sanctuary) on any fifth Sunday; our next one will be January 31.

On the second Sunday of Advent, December 6, we will have a special service centered on the hanging of the greens. Similar to a Christmas Eve service, we will have readings related to the meaning of the various decorations we use.

As a modification of our normal cantata, we will have two Sundays of special music, December 13 and 20, drawn from Handel's *Messiah*.
