Worship and Music News

Merry Christmas! The season of Christmas extends from our celebration of Christ's birth on December 25 until Epiphany on January 6 (which we will celebrate on the preceding Sunday, January 3). Then begins our journey through Christ's life, leading up to Lent. Mark your calendars now for important dates in Lent: Ash Wednesday on February 10, Palm/Passion Sunday on March 20, Maundy Thursday on March 24, and Easter on March 27. There will be special services on each of those days—watch for details.

FIRED UP! is in a transition. We are modifying the format somewhat to mimic what we have done experimentally in Advent. We will still use modern music. Until recently, we have asked individuals to give a reflection on the text, in essence a mini sermon. Now instead, we will be engaging in *lectio divina*, a spiritual practice of communally reflecting on the text that evolved in monasteries in the middle ages. We have found it to be an effective way for us all to connect to the Word. In addition, we will be **permanently relocating to the Sadler Chapel**. The service will still be held on Thursdays at 6:30.

As mentioned in a previous article, we will have a contemporary-style service in place of our traditional service on any fifth Sunday. The next time that happens in January 31. For now, the plan is to continue to use the same projector as for Thursday worship. However, that projector is not really strong enough. We would like to get a better projector, similar to what was borrowed from the university for the RCAS concerts. If we have a better projector, we may use it for other things, such as videos about the special PCUSA offerings, announcements, and so forth. The estimated cost for a projector and ancillary equipment is \$1500. If you would like to support this special expense, please contact Jonathan Kimball, or work through Betti Jo. We have a long-term plan to replace the screens with something that looks better and is less obtrusive. If you are interested in discussing that plan, see Jonathan or Jeff Sandquist. We also recognize that the church has many needs right now that may preclude the purchase of a projector.

Arc is the organization that lobbies, advocates, creates support programs and training for persons with, or assisting the Intellectually and Developmentally Disabled (IDD). We met many of the Indiana people who help Than and his local program with finances, housing issues, and care programs, plus work with legislative bodies to protect the interests of IDD persons. Than was an active participant, speaking and learning about the needs and programs of IDD persons.

And Christmas is upon us. Time to think about the many ways we are blessed. Busy lives, good friends, big plans and hopes, all driven by the way we have learned to live in the love of Jesus. We pray you have these blessings also.
