A Message from Our Pastor

Dear Friends:

When we think of September our minds may turn to school activities, football resuming, changing seasons, etc. The fall season is just around the corner promising honey crisp apples, beautiful foliage, and pumpkin flavoring and fragrance in everything from coffee to air freshener. What you may not know is in the Presbyterian Church (USA, September is also the Season of Peace which leads us to the Peace and Global Witness Offering and World Communion Sunday on October 7. Here at FPC we have a variety of opportunities designed to help us reflect what it means to know and share Christ's peace in the world.

We will begin on September 2 during worship by celebrating communion together and offering prayers for peace.

On Thursday September 6 at 6:30 p.m., in lieu of our regular Fired Up service we will have a special prayer service for Christ's peace and justice.

On Monday September 24, we will be hosting the Reverend Jerome Bizimina, a pastor from Rwanda. He joins us as part of our denomination's international peacemaker program. He is the President of Remera Presbytery, and is the initiator of the Light Group, bringing together survivors and perpetrators of the 1994 genocide of Tutsi Rwandans. He will share how the church helps bring about reconciliation, and the role faith place in this difficult process. He will be with us the afternoon of the 24th and on campus in the evening. (We will release more details on Rev. Bizimina's time here at the church as we confirm plans.)

On Sunday September 29, our Mission Committee will host a mission fair during fellowship in the fellowship hall so we can share the many ways we minister and share Christ's peace throughout our community.

On Sunday October 7 we will collect the Peace and Global Witness Offering, celebrate World Communion Sunday and have a special stewardship speaker, the Rev. Charles Spencer.

We hope these special activities will help us all reflect on the meaning of Christ's peace in our lives and in our community.

POLICY UPDATE FOR BORROWING ITEMS FROM THE CHURCH FOR PERSONAL USE

If you have ever wondered about the Session's policy about borrowing items belonging to the church, here is the policy.

Question: Can I borrow tables and chairs from the church for personal use at home or another location?

Answer: YES, but only if you come to the office, complete the proper form, and receive permission.

On August 20, 2018 the Session voted to allow individuals to borrow tables and chairs from the church, but in order to avoid any conflicts with the church calendar, one must come to the church office to complete the form and receive permission. You must complete the form at least 5 days in advance of the date you wish to borrow the items.

Question: Can I borrow table cloths, cooking equipment, projectors, pews, pianos, etc. from the church for personal use at home or at another location?

Answer: NO, the Session has determined no one may borrow any items or remove any items from the church for personal use except for tables and chairs.

The list of items needed to fill the bucket is on the lids. Groups, Couples, Individuals may take a bucket, fill it with the requested items and return it to the hallway by **OCTOBER 28**th. If you would like to contribute, but do not want to fill a whole bucket, please mark off the item on the list you would like to purchase, place the item in the bucket, and others will do the same.

John Calvin PDA thanks us for our continued support for this project. Our buckets, along with the many others filled throughout the presbytery, will be taken to the PDA warehouse near Little Rock. These buckets will be added to the buckets stored and be ready to send to the next area of disaster.

The buckets are to be filled with the following (no more, no less). SHOPPING LIST FOR BUCKETS – please purchase the sizes requested. The buckets must be able to seal completely and these items fit the bucket.

•One (1) five-gallon bucket with resealable lid
•Five (5) scouring pads (like Scotch-Brite)
•Seven (7) sponges, assorted sizes
•One scrub brush
•Eighteen (18) cleaning towels (reusable, like Handi-Wipes®)
•One (1) 30-40 oz. box dry laundry detergent (LARGER WON'T FIT)
•One (1) 12 oz. bottle of liquid concentrated household cleaner (like Lysol®)
•One (1) 21-25 oz. bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®)
•One (1) package of 48-50 clothespins
•Clothesline, (2) two 50 ft. or (1) one 100 ft.
•Five (5) dust masks
•Two (2) pairs latex gloves (like Playtex®)
•One (1) pair work gloves
•28ct. bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon)
• One (1) 6-9 oz. bottle of insect repellent (pump, drops or lotion, not aerosol
