Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

We give you thanks that the Lord Jesus, on the night before he died, while eating with his disciples, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it and gave it to his disciples and said: Take, eat. This is my body. Then took a cup and after giving thanks he gave it to them saying, "Drink from it all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you I will never again drink of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen
