We start out waiting for a savior, recognize Jesus of Nazareth as the promised Messiah, mourn his death and celebrate his resurrection, welcome the Holy Spirit, then anticipate Christ's coming at the end of the age.

But for now, we are waiting. Waiting for a savior. Waiting to encounter God. Yet, Jesus told us that we do not need to wait.

34 Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world, 35 for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, 36_I was naked, and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison, and you visited me.' 37 Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you...?' 40 And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me.'

We look for Christ in all the wrong places. We wait for the Son of Man to come on a cloud in power and glory, when he is already here among us. We just need to see as God sees, to recognize Christ in the least, the lost, and the last.

This Advent season, as we wait for the beauty of Christmas, let us also have eyes to see and ears to hear Christ in each person we meet. Let us seek opportunities to enter God's kingdom by sharing God's love with those who need to know God as we do. Amen.
